FAITH EDUCATION CORNER

Called to Love

The theme of today's Mass is clearly love. This is seen in the second reading and the gospel. Our Christian faith should not be just seen as a religion, something tacked on to an otherwise secular life, which in most respects is the same as everyone else's. Our Christian faith is **a vision of how a human life should be lived in fullness**. It teaches us how to be **a real person**.

God's love

God loves me unconditionally but that love is not in me if I am not passing it on to others. In the gospel Jesus does not say we need to love God, or Jesus himself. He says 'This is my commandment - **love one another** as I have loved you.'

In one way, to be a Christian is very simple. In practice, of course, it is not always so easy. We need to learn slowly how to **love people unconditionally**. It is more human to be loving than hating. However, we often do not know how to love, do not know how to forgive, do not know how to be reconciled.

Love is not a question of keeping rules and commandments. Love is a way of life. It is an internal attitude which influences every single thing we do and say and think. People often learn to love by being loved.

The most important thing is that I am someone who really loves. When I genuinely love others, there will always be some who cannot love me back, but there will be others who will really respond in love. And it may be that my love has empowered them to be loving too. To be able to **reach out in love** and to **experience being loved** is God's greatest grace. SOCIAL JUSTICE SNIPPETS

Message for the Feast of St Joseph the Worker: Inequality facing Indigenous Australian Workers

Last year, The Bishops of Australia issued their Social Justice Statement Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People, highlighting the systemic dispossession facing Australia's Indigenous Peoples, and calling for a new way forward that respects their dignity and cultural heritage.

These are challenges that Indigenous Australians have faced for generations, and efforts to address the significant gaps between Indigenous and Non-Indigenous Australians have met with middling success. Disparity in employment remains one of the key indicators of efforts to close the gap, and a driving factor affecting social, economic, and health outcomes.

The Feast of St. Joseph the Worker emphasizes the dignity of labor and the importance of work in the life of an individual, as exemplified by Saint Joseph's dedication to his craft as a carpenter. **Historical Context**

To comprehend the challenges faced by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the contemporary workforce, it is imperative to acknowledge the historical injustices that have shaped their experiences. Colonization, dispossession of land, forced removal of children (the Stolen Generations), and discriminatory policies have had enduring impacts on Indigenous communities. By recognizing and working in partnership with First Nations Peoples in addressing these challenges, we can strive towards a future where Indigenous individuals have equal opportunities to thrive and succeed in their chosen careers

The gap in employment rate steadily decreases with education level, with Indigenous Australians holding a bachelor's degree or higher at parity with non-indigenous Australians. More than half of Indigenous Children are not consistently attending a school. Unfortunately, disparity in educational attainment remains one of the critical drivers of inequality and targets to close the gap at most education levels are not on track, with Children more than twice as likely as non-indigenous children to be missing indigenous schooling opportunities.—ACBC Office of Justice Ecology and Peace.
