FAITH EDUCATION CORNER

The Gospel of John does not get a dedicated year in the Lectionary, such as the other, synoptic, gospels do. We have Matthew in Year A, Mark in Year B (this year) and Luke in Year C. The gospel of John includes very few events from the life of Jesus. The few incidents that are included are followed by lengthy discourses. These need to be taken slowly and reflectively.

The gospel of John is used particularly during the Easter season – on most of the Sundays of Easter and weekdays of the Easter season.

This Sunday (4th of Easter) has the well-known passage about **the Good Shepherd** (John 10:11-18), and that theme continues on Mon and Tues. This image of Jesus as the good shepherd is very well known, and is perhaps one of the best known and loved images of Jesus.

A good guide to understanding the gospel of John is found at the gospel commentary site of Fr John McKinnon – a retired Australian scripture scholar. http://johnmckinnon.org/index.php/gospel-commentaries/john-gospel The site has an overall **introduction to John's gospel**, including some examples of phrases and images that have accompanied Fr John on his spiritual journey.

The gospel of John very clearly states that Jesus' acceptance of death was an expression of his commitment to love the world, whatever the cost. Jesus, the one sent by God, was indeed, the revelation of the mind and heart of Giod. In order to save the world from rivalry, competition, conflict and violence, Jesus brought the message of consistent and **unconditional love**. And while the world judged that to be naïve and unrealistic, his message has endured long after his death.

The disciples sensed the truth of his message, and continued to live and share it, convinced that this was the way to live life to the full.
